

HULL HARBORMASTER DEPARTMENT

Town of Hull Mooring Rules and Regulations

1. No placing of moorings without first receiving approval from the Harbormaster Department .The Harbormaster Department has sole discretion on all commercial and recreational mooring locations in the waters of the Town of Hull.
2. All moorings must be installed by a mooring service company approved by the Harbormaster Department.
3. All moorings must meet the criteria and specification for said mooring location and be inspected by the Harbormaster Department before being placed in the water
4. No mooring can be moved, adjusted and or relocated without prior approval from the Harbormaster.
5. No mooring location can be sold, trade or leased or rented.
6. When a boat is sold with its mooring hardware, the mooring location reverts back to the Town of Hull Harbormaster Department, if the new owner needs a mooring location, he or she must submit a mooring

application to the Harbormaster Department for a location assignment, if the area has a waiting list, he or she will be placed on that list.

7. Owners not using their moorings for the season and would like to maintain their location must still pay their vessel boat excise tax and mooring fee's for that year, as well as maintain the mooring rig to all current rules and regulations. Failure to comply will result in the removal of the mooring hardware at the owner's expense and loss of the mooring location.
8. If a mooring owner would like to place a different vessel on his or her mooring, permission must first be granted by the Harbormaster Department .If approval is granted and the vessel is to be moored for the season, the owner must obtain a separate mooring permit to be displayed on the guest vessel. Guest vessel length cannot exceed the length applied for by the mooring owner.
9. All mooring rigs must be winterized by the first week in November and all winter sticks must be removed by the first week in June. All moorings must use an approved mooring ball, 18 inches or greater in diameter, white with a blue stripe and the owners name clearly marked in black. Commercial lobster boat moorings are exempt from this rule.
10. Any mooring that fails its inspection and or is left in the water in such a manner as to constitute a hazard to navigation, personal safety or property may be removed

at the owner's expense after being notified by the Harbormaster Department or the mooring service provider. The mooring location will be held until such time that the mooring rig is brought up to Town of Hull mooring specifications and reinstalled. If the owner fails to repair his or her mooring rig in a timely manner, the location reverts to the Town of Hull Harbormaster Department for reassignment

11. Failure to comply with the Town of Hull Mooring Rules and Regulations or if he or she refuses or neglects to obey the lawful and reasonable orders of the Harbormaster or resists him in the execution of his duties shall be fined \$50.00 per day fine and a loss of mooring privileges in the Town of Hull. The removal of mooring hardware from the water and storage of same will be at the owner's expense.
