Minutes Approved

Minutes from April, 2023 were approved with amendment. Take out cost estimate from Jake as it was from another town.

Summary of Discussion

Joint Meetings with Select and HMLP

Jake suggested moving this item to the next meeting since election is not certified yet (delay due to the house fire), and aim for our first joint meeting in July or August. Jake will put in proper meeting notice. Lucinda asked to go over the goals/objectives for the joint meetings.

Jake- The goal is to get to Net Zero by 2030, and the conversation with both boards will be how to do that. We will present CECAC's original report since no action has been taken so far. The

goal is to make sure action is taken on our report. We will set the expectation that we will be meeting more than once per year with them to review progress toward Net Zero.

Eva asked if we could ask them (Select Board and HMLP) for measurable interim goals to meet. Brianna working on an action plan for Hull, working closely with our committee, and with the town throughout.

Rick- we need to state who is responsible for what in our presentation.

Our report is on the shared drive and Hull2030.com.

Lucinda offered to turn CECAC's annual report into a Power Point to send out for edits.

Survey

Survey – Jake suggested doing three targeted surveys: One for residents, one for businesses and one for people who will do the things we want done.

Judeth would like to do one on Solar Rapid Transit. It could be folded into transportation.

Eva wants to know if trash haulers plan to electrify trucks and landscapers who plan to go electric instead of gas-powered equipment. We can't endorse companies as a committee. Could the Select Board require these companies to go electric? Jake thinks the Select Board does have the power when they apply for renewal of business license but we have to be careful about cost and balance. Brianna said companies have to offer recycling service to operate in Hull (waste haulers).

Jake mentioned battery recycling as an example. He could not get info from local waste hauler about who/where to recycle them. We could write an article that could prompt a local business to offer that service for example.

Update from Brianna

Brianna gave a thorough presentation and summary of other towns with climate action and resiliency plans. She made an update on the climate action resiliency plan outline. She went through her Power Point presentation on what other towns have done and how they have presented their Climate Action and Resiliency Plans. A very helpful presentation.

Some towns hire a sustainability coordinator and others like Hingham it is led by Committee. Some towns hire a consultant, which can be expensive. Brianna is trying to do for Hull what they would do (for free!!).

Jake asked her to send out the Power Point, and he will forward it with the 2022 annual CECAC report.

Hull Times article topic suggestions:

New Business

Mark Kohn reached out to Michael Howland at MIT does research on tidal power. He also fixes wind turbines. He emailed back. Dept. of Civil and Envr. Engineering. He said he would like to meet with us. He is traveling but happy to connect in June. They have a \$50 m grant to study this. He is into flow physics, and he has a You Tube video demonstrating energy from tidal flow.

Brianna said Inflation Reduction Act released funds for clean energy, and may include tidal power (30%).

Rick- Boston Globe had articles on Blue Sky Boston—where aspiration meets inspiration (written as if from the future). They show a Net Zero energy building with ground source heat pumps. There is also an article on transportation that talks about a gondola system (like solar rapid transit Judeth has mentioned).

Discussed smart metering and HMLP reimbursement rate for solar. HMLP expects to get new software by the end of the year would be able to do more like time of use rate, etc.

Sustainable South Shore meeting next week to discuss South Shore news network (Judeth).
