Special Town Meeting Article Discussion

Article 9 Additional License for the sale of all alcoholic beverages

Proponent of the citizens petition Christine Rivieccio of 16 Merrill Road is in attendance, along with Quick Pick owner Bobby Patel of 22 Sagamore Terrace. Christine explained that with the seasonal traffic in town, and the handicapped accessibility at the location, it is easy and convenient to patronize this location if you are a resident of the area.

Mr. Patel of 22 Sagamore Terrace, the owner's son, spoke to the purchase of the location that opened in March 2014 and the gradual increase in number and type of items sold and the accessibility for the handicapped. An additional license would increase valuable commercial storefront, increase value of the building, increase taxes on building to the town. Beer and wine is already sold at the location, but this change would utilize commercial space that has been vacant (used for storage) for the past 10 years.

Advisory Board and Proponent discussion

Three steps required to obtain the license: 1) Article must pass at Special Town Meeting 2) Select board will have to approve, then petition the state legislature for home rule to increase the number of licenses 3) State legislature must approve. Attorney Lampke explained that this article specifies the address, which limits the license to this particular business and location and cannot be transferred to other locations. Were the building sold, the license could remain at that location if a transfer of the license were approved. There is another liquor store nearby in the same neighborhood that is not currently handicapped accessible. There is currently a vacant storefront adjacent to the existing convenience store that is used for storage. Should this pass, that storefront and area will be used for beer/wine/alcohol and space will be freed up in the existing refrigeration devices in the convenience store that will allow additional non-alcoholic beverages and food to be sold. Advisory board member Dan Sullivan expressed concern on the increasing the number of liquor licenses in the community, due to size, and due to negative impact to existing liquor stores. Other Advisory Board members noted that community support exists, and that the business owner has invested in multiple properties in Hull, operated as a responsible business owner and has been a valuable member of the community.

Articles 6-8 Zoning and General By-Law changes to add Adult Recreational Marijuana Sales to existing dispensary

Bruce McWhorter of 21 Edgewater Road is the Hull resident and local petitioner for all three articles, and is in attendance. Stephen Werther, President and CEO of Alternate Compassion Services, who runs the business, spoke to the wish to add an adult use license to existing medical marijuana dispensary. The expansion to marijuana sale for recreational use was on the warrant for the May 2023 Town Meeting, but was pulled due to a discrepancy with the General Bylaw that was not addressed in the article that was on the warrant.

Concern expressed by Paul Schneider that the wording limiting a special permit to establishments that have been licensed and lawfully operating within Hull for at least one year will adversely affect any other new hopeful potential recreational marijuana businesses. Attorney Lampke confirmed current laws in Hull limit marijuana establishments to two total. Bruce McWhorter stated that he believes a retail marijuana facility would generate at least \$500-\$800K in tax revenue each year, based on Rockland's tax revenue last year from their 3 retail establishments (\$2.5M).

- Article 6 Amendment of Zoning Bylaws to allow an existing Registered Marijuana Dispensary to add adult use retail sales. Requires a 2/3 majority vote at Special Town Meeting.
- Article 7 Amendment of General Bylaws to allow an existing Registered Marijuana Dispensary to add adult use retail sales. Requires a simple majority vote at Special Town Meeting.
- Article 8 Local tax increase to 3% for marijuana sales

Dan Sullivan of the Advisory Board expressed concern about traffic increase should this pass, and his wish to include police detail planning/funding as part of the host agreement. Discussion ensued on current business host community agreement with the Town of Hull and ACS payment status, and the state legislature changes made since the initial agreement that impact the host community agreement. Open question on whether the state legislature can change a law that affects the existing host agreement contract for the medial marijuana business (between Select Board and ACS).

Article 3 Conservation Bylaw Amendments

Chris Krahforst presented and explained that the existing Conservation Bylaw pertains to enforcement. The Commission would like to double the fees for after-the-fact work, to more than what is imposed by the Wetlands Protection Act. Hull is the only town in the area that does not currently include local administration fee structured on top of the required Wetlands Protection Act fees. Costs have increased, and the balance for conservation funds is decreasing as a result. The fee increases would help fund the administration of the conservation commission and would restore the fund to required levels.

Local Wetland Bylaws in section C are new, important pieces of the requested STM articles. The first, section (a), is the result of a recent EPA ruling/update. The second, section (b) is important in protecting and preserving our primary dune.

David Clinton posed the question to Chris as to why now, during STM, and not during annual TM. Chris feels there is some urgency, especially since the change will take some time to be approved by the Massachusetts AG, should the amendments pass.

Article 5 Fort Revere Tower Renovation Funds

Irwin Nesoff explained that the Select Board will be voting on 8/16, and cannot represent the final decision of the board.

Town approved renovations up to \$2.2M at May 2022 Town Meeting but the estimated costs have increased to between \$2.5M & \$3M. Three bids have been received, between \$2.5-\$3M. This will not

include public access to the tower (no change to scope since May 2022 article). This article seeks to cover the increased cost.

Article 4 Departmental Equipment Purchases

Irwin Nesoff explained that the Select Board will be voting on 8/16, and cannot represent the final decision of the board. At this time, details on the type of equipment and the department to be used for are not available. Request initiated by Town Accountant.

If passed, this will likely require one extra meeting of the appointing authority to agree to proposed articles for consent agenda. Mr. Lampke recommends removal of the specification 'related to each other'.
