The mission of the Hull Historical Commission is to document and preserve the historic fabric of the town.

Past Quarter

- HHC Advises the Fort Revere Park and Preservation Society with their efforts at Fort Revere. FRPPS has planned a day (July 16th) to Paint the Fort with the anti-graffiti paint provided by the HRA, working with volunteers and town officials.
- FRPPS and HHC have been working with Robert Blunt of Kleinfelder, which did the engineering study on the Water Tower as to the best approach for the restorations to the tower and the fort. We are seeking donations and grants, and perhaps some CPA money. No money from the town.
- FRPPS and HHC have been negotiating with a company which has a new cement produce that has found to be cost effective for dealing with cement spalling, a major issue at the fort and tower. We will arrange a demonstration.
- The Hull Historical Society has granted permission to HHC to scan and preserve their photo collection at the First Town Hall. HHC will submit a proposal using the Omeka software to post the collection on the town website.
- Members of the HHC twice met with Chris Dilorio of the Planning Board and others to discuss town signage and to pertaining to the grant that the town has received.
- HHC has appointed a representative member to the Community Preservation Committee, Fulvia Quilici Matteucci.
- Fulvia and Don Ritz, HHC and Hull Historic District Commission Chair, and other members of the HHC have researched, designed, had produced 2 historic plaques for the library. They were installed on the west side of the Library by members of HHC.
- HHC continues to document historic properties in town. This quarter we plan to document 2 historic houses on Point Allerton which are slated for demolition or major renovation.

HHC meets 2nd Monday of each month at town hall. 7pm

HHC is an unfunded commission. Members are not paid.

HHC is made up of 7 members. There are currently 3 vacancies
