WHAT TO EXPECT WHEN YOU COME TO VOTE IN PERSON

Hull Voters, please review the following protocols that will be in place for our Annual Town Election to ensure the safety of Voters and Staff during this current pandemic:

- Please wear a facial covering to protect staff and other voters (unless for health reasons you are unable to do so). We are taking this very seriously and highly encourage all voters to do their part and be considerate of others.
- If you do not have a facial covering, one will be provided.
- A limited amount of disposable gloves will be provided for those that would like to wear them.
- Please be aware that only voters will be allowed to go into the polling place.
- Social distancing will be enforced; voter(s) shall maintain a six (6) foot distance from one another that will be clearly marked, both inside and outside.
- If you require any special accommodations please inform the Police officer on duty or an Election official.
- You will enter in one way (Library Door) and exit through a separate door (Gym Parking Door) (See High School Polling Location layout).
- Anyone with a mobility concern and or Handicap may park in the Gym Parking Lot and use a separate designated door to the polling location.
- You may bring your own BLACK or BLUE (ONLY) pen with a clip board.
- You will be greeted by an election worker who will direct you to your precinct.
- No more than (4) voters will be allowed in each precinct at one time.

- Voters will check- in with an election officer who will be in sitting in front of a
 plastic germ barrier wearing a facial mask. You will be required to give your name
 and address in a loud voice so the election officer can hear you. You will be
 provided with your ballot and a pen to mark your ballot.
- There will be four (4) Voting booths set up with a distance of min. (6) feet between each.
- When you complete filling out your ballot you will then proceed to the check-out table where you will be greeted by an Election Officer who will be sitting in front of a plastic germ barrier wearing a facial mask. You will again be required to give your name and address in a loud voice so that the Election Officer can hear you.
- Now you will be ready to cast your ballot in the voting machine.
- Please return the pen into the designated basket beside the voting machine.
- Voting booths and pens will be sanitized after each use. Hand Sanitizer will be provided throughout the polling location.
- You will now exit the polling location, depositing the used disposable mask and/or gloves in a designated trash barrel.
- You have now completed your civic duty.

Lastly, on behalf of the Town Clerk's Office, Election Team and all the Town Departments involved with preparing and executing this opportunity for each of us to exercise our right to vote, we wish to extend our appreciation for your cooperation in following the guidelines that have been set forth to ensure a safe election day for all.
