

TOWN OF HULL RESTRICTED AND OTHER AREAS PARKING REGULATIONS See Reverse Side for Municipal Parking Regulations

E N F O R C E M E N T AGENCY

- 1) <u>EFFECTIVE DATE/FEES:</u> June 22, 2020, and subject to being rescinded, modified or amended by the Board of Selectmen/Traffic Commissioners; COSTS; Restricted Area Permit \$14.00 for one year period (Persons over sixty-five \$7.00), (Handicap No Charge), (Veterans No Charge); Visitors Passes \$14.00 each for one (1) year period. (No Discounts) Payment: Debit/Charge Care or Checks with Valid Identification. NO CASH
- **ELIGIBILITY:** Motor vehicles owned by residents of the Town of Hull, property owners, renters & tenants. Licensed lodging and rooming houses located in the restricted areas are entitled to a number of visitors passes not to exceed the capacity for occupancy as identified on the establishment's certificates of occupancy as established by the Board of Health and/or Building Department.
- 3) HOW TO OBTAIN PERMIT:, ON-LINE OR BY FILING/MAIL Upon payment, will be mailed
- **PERMIT ALLOWS YOU TO PARK:** On a public street at your place of residence, or in the Municipal Parking Areas. The permit in no way allows you to park illegally; you must still obey all other parking rules, regulations and codes of the Town of Hull as well as any special parking orders. - **<u>VISITOR PARKING PERMITS:</u>** Each resident assigned a permit is eligible to purchase visitors passes. The visitor's passes are restricted to the applicants' residence and are not valid within Municipal Parking areas. Residents who do not own a motor vehicle are eligible for visitors' passes to be used at the residence assigned only. (Residents of Bay Street may use visitor's passes in same manner as a Bay Street restricted sticker.)
- **VIOLATORS:** Unless otherwise provided for, any person who parks within the restricted area without a valid permit or visitors pass will be issued a parking citation for which the minimum fine is \$100.00. Violators are subject to re-ticketing after four(4) hours. The Police Department will periodically check to determine if the program is working and to ensure that permits/passes are not being abused. Permits or passes can also be revoked or suspended.
- 7) **LOST OR STOLEN PERMITS/PASSES:** If a resident loses or has their permit or visitors pass stolen, they shall notify the Police Department and will be re-issued additional permits/passes for the same fee.
- **CHANGING MOTOR VEHICLES:** If for any reason you are changing your motor vehicle such as buying a new one or selling an old one, please remove the permit and bring it and your registration to the Police Department at which time it will be voided and a replacement issued at a cost of \$12.00 for first to third (3) month \$9.00 for four (4) to six (6) months and \$8.00 for months seven (7) to twelve (12).
- 9) PERMITS and PASSES DISPLAYED: Permits shall be displayed in the front lower left hand (drivers) side window. PERMITS MUST BE CLEARLY VISIBLE. VISITORS PASSES DISPLAYED: On interior of motor vehicle on dashboard so as to be CLEARLY VISIBLE at all times. Vehicles should be secure with windows closed to avoid theft or removal.
- RESTRICTED & OTHER AREAS DEFINED AND CONDITIONS: All streets and ways in the Town are subject to this restricted parking plan and any orders of the Town. In addition- (1) West side of Surfside from Water Street & Nantasket Avenue to Sagamore Terrace, 1 hour max for metered spots; must move vehicle or reticketed; Sagamore Terrace to Anastos Corner, 2 hour max for metered spots; must move vehicle or reticketed; \$50.00 fine per occurrence. (2) East side of Surfside from Water Street & Nantasket Avenue to Anastos Corner, 2 hour max for metered spots; must move vehicle or reticketed, \$50.00 fine per occurrence; (3) Kenberma Business District, both sides, Revere Street to Kenberma Street, metered spots, 1 hour max for metered spots; must move vehicle or reticketed; \$50.00 fine per occurrence.
- **EXCEPTIONS IN THE DEFINED AREAS:** Not in effect between 10:00 PM to 6:00 AM of the following day or in the immediate area of commercial establishments while conducting a commercial transaction; churches, temples, or public buildings while conducting services or activities or where posted or authorized by authority of the Police Department.
