

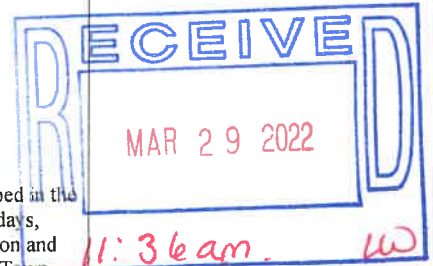


MEETING NOTICE POSTING & AGENDA
