

TOWN OF HULL FALL 2020 ELECTIONS VOTER GUIDE & KNOW BEFORE YOU GO

On July 6th the Governor signed new legislation - An Act relative to voting options in response to COVID. This legislation outlines 3 options for voting in the Fall 2020 Elections: **(1) Vote by Mail** **(2) Vote Early In Person** or **(3) Vote on Election Day**

1. Am I a registered voter & What is my Voter Status (Active or Inactive)

The deadline to register to vote or change your party affiliation for the November 3, 2020 State Election is **Saturday, October 24.**
(NEW VOTERS OR NEW TO TOWN)

INACTIVE VOTERS

On Election Day or at Early Voting, some voters may find that their names have been placed on the list of inactive voters. The inactive voters list is made up of registered voters who have not responded to the annual street list or subsequent confirmation notice. **Inactive voters may still vote** but will first be asked to show identification and will be required to fill out an affirmation of current and continuous residence.

You will also be asked to present identification which shows your name and the address at which you are registered to vote. It is not required that you present photo identification. Acceptable forms of identification include: a driver's license, state-issued ID card, recent utility bill, rent receipt, lease, a copy of a voter registration affidavit, or any other printed identification which contains your name and address.

As soon as you have completed the affirmation of current and continuous residence, you will be restored to the active voters list.

REMOVAL FROM THE LIST OF INACTIVE VOTERS

Inactive voters remain registered to vote until they fail to vote in two consecutive biennial state elections. Inactive voters are restored to the active voters list any time they complete an affirmation of current and continuous residence, fill out a new voter registration form, or submit anything to their local election official which is signed under penalty of perjury and confirms the voter's address.

All Elections will be held at the **Hull High School, 180 Main Street**

WHAT TO BRING TO THE POLLS ON ELECTION DAY

- **Wear a Face Covering**
- **Bring a Pen** – Blue or Black ink sharpie or Paper Mate Flair (if you don't want to borrow one)
- **Bring a Clip Board or Book** to mark your ballot on (if you don't want to use a Voting Booth)
- **Bring an ID** – in some cases voters will be required to show an ID or if you are in "Inactive" status, you will need to show proof of residency.
- **Please do not touch your face or shake hands with anyone** while at the polling location
- **Maintain Social Distancing** – keep 6' away from anyone not from your household
- **Keep your ballot dry and free from hand sanitizers** - Do not use hand sanitizer while handling your ballot and be sure your voting booth is dry as it will cause issues tabulator breakdowns

OUR COMMITMENT TO KEEP VOTERS SAFE:

- Recommend All Voters wear Face Coverings
- Voting Booths will be cleaned throughout the day
