

# ATLANTIC AVENUE PROJECT UPDATE 6/30/2022

In coordination with the MassDOT, the Contractor (P.A. Landers), and various other stakeholders, the Town of Hull through CHA Consulting Inc. is releasing biweekly updates to keep the public informed of the construction progress and impacts to traffic and locals. Please keep in mind that while these updates are intended to provide as accurate and up-to-date information as possible, construction activity can change on a day-to-day basis.

## Previous Two Weeks Summary

In the previous weeks, the Contractor, P.A. Landers, has installed the new underground stormwater drainage system between Nantasket Avenue and Straits Pond (near the basketball court/ Green Hill Playground).

Hull Municipal Light Plant (HMLP) has completed most of the utility pole relocations along Atlantic Ave.

## **Two Week Look Ahead**

Following the July 4<sup>th</sup> Holiday Weekend, work will continue between the Green Hill Playground and Stony Beach Road from July 5<sup>th</sup> to July 8<sup>th</sup>. Following that, underground drainage installation will continue east for the next 3 weeks between Montana Avenue and Gunrock Avenue.

Hull Municipal Light Plant (HMLP) will be working to complete the utility pole relocations and construct the cross arms at the top of the poles over the next two weeks. Then they will begin work on transferring over the overhead electrical wires to the new poles. Expect HMLP crews to be working throughout Atlantic Avenue over the next two weeks.

### **Traffic Impacts**

Expect thru vehicle traffic to be detoured between School Street and Jerusalem Road during the daytime for the foreseeable future with one lane of traffic open for school buses and local traffic. Pedestrians, bicycles, and emergency vehicles will continue to be able to travel through the construction area. Access to residences, businesses and the Town Hall will be maintained.

Trenches will be restored with asphalt patching at the end of each week. Please remember to use caution while traveling through the construction area. The construction may cause noise disruption during the work hours of 7:00 AM to 3:30 PM.
