MARCH 23, 2020

Good afternoon.

Effective at noon on Tuesday, March 24, Governor Baker has ordered all non-essential business to close their physical locations and is advising people to stay at home to avoid person-to-person contact until noon on April 7th.

Grocery stores, gas stations, and healthcare providers, among others will remain open for business. If you are unsure if a business in Hull is open please call them directly. While out shopping, please remember to abide by social distancing, wash your hands frequently, and avoid large groups of people.

We are adding new Hull specific information daily so please check back frequently.

In order to preserve essential service delivery all Town of Hull offices have restricted public access until April 7th. Many Town employees are working from home in an effort to continue to provide services. Please leave voicemails and emails for specific offices and we will do our best to respond as soon as possible. Please visit the Town website if you need access to permits or other administrative services. We have many forms and other documents on-line and there is the ability to make payments on-line as well.

Hull Police and Fire personnel are on duty and are ready and able respond to emergencies. Our Board of Health staff is in contact with both federal and state officials multiple times per day to stay up to date on any issue confronting the Town. Our Department of Public Works, Light Department and Sewer Department are all on the job and continuing to work on your behalf. Our Senior Center is providing meals on wheels and outreach to our senior population.

While the changes we have all experienced in the past few weeks can at times be challenging it is remarkable to see how generous we all can be when confronted with a shared threat. I always found it interesting that in the alphabet section of Town there is no "I" Street. I like to believe it is because there is no "I" in Team. One Town One Team!
