Hull Municipal Light Plant Awarded Energy Efficient Street Lighting Grant

Hull, Mass. -- December 14, 2016 -- Hull Municipal Light Plant has received a \$143,575 grant under the state Department of Energy Resources' LED Street Lighting Accelerator Program to help pay for the cost of new energy efficient LED street light fixtures, long-life photo-electric controllers and wireless controllers for the fixtures. This amount covers approximately 38% of the costs of converting the entire 1100 street lights in Hull to energy-efficient LED lights.

The Baker-Polito Administration has announced a total of \$11.4 million in grant funds are being awarded to municipal light plants in more than 30 communities.

Light Department Operation Manager Panos Tokadjian, Town Manager Phil Lemnios and Light Board Commissioners express their appreciation to Governor Baker and his administration for this significant grant that will provide for safer streetscapes while protecting rate payer interests.

Hull Municipal Light Plant will work with Massachusetts Municipal Wholesale Electric Company (MMWEC), and the Commonwealth's Department of Energy Resources to administer the grant.
