S125-1. Criteria and method for naming memorials.

- A. The Selectmen will direct an investigating committee to convene, which committee will be headed by and selected by the Commander of the Hull/Hingham Veterans of Foreign Wars Post No. 1787. The committee makes an investigation and reports its recommendations to the Selectmen, who will have final approval.
- 1. Any sponsor who requests a naming must do so in writing, supported by valid documentation, to the investigating committee. This documentation must include discharge papers, citations, awards and decorations, etc. (Do not send originals.)
- 2. All persons, upon making application to the investigating committee, who served in the armed forces in time of conflict and were residents of the Town of Hull during that service, will have their name affixed to the Soldiers and Sailors Monument located at Monument Square.
- 3. The names of all persons who served in the Armed Forces of the United States during an armed conflict are included in the dedication of Veterans Road, the Memorial School and any future memorials which may be constructed pursuant to such service within the Town of Hull.
- 4. All residents of the Town of Hull who served in the armed forces during peace time are included in memorials raised to that service.
