

# ATLANTIC AVENUE PROJECT UPDATE

May 1, 2023

## Previous Two Weeks Summary

In the previous two weeks, the Contractor has been busy with work throughout much of Atlantic Avenue. The Contractor has installed the granite curbing and begun paving the sidewalks on Atlantic Avenue between Nantasket Avenue and Richards Road. In addition, the first course of pavement was paved between Stony Beach Road and 900 ft. east of Gunrock Avenue. The third and final phase of the full depth roadway excavation has begun which will stretch between 900 ft. east of Gunrock Avenue and the eastern project limits at the Cohasset Town Line.

## Two Week Look Ahead

The Contractor will continue excavating the roadway between 900 ft. east of Gunrock Avenue and the Cohasset Town for the next two-to-three weeks. The asphalt pavement will be removed, and Atlantic Avenue will have a gravel surface in this area while the Contractor places new gravel and re-grades the roadway.

In addition, the second course of pavement will be paved between Stony Beach Road and 900 ft. east of Gunrock Avenue on Tuesday, May 2<sup>nd</sup>. Granite curb installation in this area will commence on May 8<sup>th</sup> followed by the construction of the new sidewalks.

Any driveways that have decorative surfaces (cobblestones, pavers, sea-shells, etc.) that are impacted by the roadway work will be temporarily stored until the Contractor is ready to re-install them.

### **Traffic Impacts**

Expect through vehicle traffic to be detoured between School Street and Jerusalem Road during the daytime for the foreseeable future with one lane of traffic open for local traffic. Pedestrians, bicycles, school buses, and emergency vehicles will continue to be able to travel through the construction area. Access to residences, businesses and the Town Hall will also be maintained. At least one travel lane will be maintained at all times with police directing traffic as needed.

Please exercise caution traveling through Atlantic Avenue and seek alternate routes when possible. The construction may cause noise disruption during the work hours of 7:00 AM to 3:30 PM.
