

# ATLANTIC AVENUE PROJECT UPDATE

Monday September 11, 2023

## **Previous Two Weeks Summary**

In the previous two weeks, the Contractor has been working to install granite curbing and paving sidewalks throughout the project.

## Two Week Look Ahead

The Contractor will be working on various sections of Atlantic Avenue over the next few weeks with several different construction operations. This includes:

- Granite curb installation on Atlantic Avenue primarily between Gunrock Avenue and the Cohasset Town Line on the northern side of the road.
- Paving driveways and constructing the cement concrete pedestrian curb ramps throughout Atlantic Avenue.

Any driveways that have decorative surfaces (cobblestones, pavers, sea-shells, etc.) that are impacted by the roadway work will be temporarily stored until the Contractor is ready to re-install them.

Driveways will need to be closed for several hours while the sidewalk and driveways are paved and given time to cool before it can be driven or walked on.

#### **Traffic Impacts**

Expect through vehicle traffic to be detoured between School Street and Jerusalem Road during the daytime for the foreseeable future with one lane of traffic open for local traffic. Pedestrians, bicycles, school buses, and emergency vehicles will continue to be able to travel through the construction area. Access to residences, businesses and the Town Hall will also be maintained. At least one travel lane will be maintained at all times with police directing traffic as needed.

Please exercise caution traveling through Atlantic Avenue and seek alternate routes when possible. The construction may cause noise disruption during the work hours of 7:00 AM to 3:30 PM.
