

ATLANTIC AVENUE PROJECT UPDATE March 27, 2024

Previous Two Weeks Summary

In the previous two weeks, the Contractor has been working to complete the installation of granite curbing and repair curb that was damaged over the winter, as well as raising the covers for manholes to the finished roadway grades.

Two Week Look Ahead

The Contractor will be continuing the installation of curbing and raising manhole covers over the next two weeks. This work will be conducted throughout the entire stretch of Atlantic Avenue.

The other remaining work to be carried out over the next several months includes:

- Installation of drainage structure and pipe at the intersection with Montana Ave.
- Completion of sidewalk paving
- Pavement milling, mostly on side streets at the limits of work
- Paving the final surface course of pavement throughout the project.
- Installing new pavement markings and signage

The Contractor is currently ahead of schedule with the project anticipated to be substantially completed by the beginning of July.

Traffic Impacts

Through vehicle traffic may be detoured as necessary between School Street and Jerusalem Road during the daytime for the foreseeable future with one lane of traffic open for local traffic. Pedestrians, bicycles, school buses, and emergency vehicles will continue to be able to travel through the construction area. Access to residences, businesses and the Town Hall will also be maintained. At least one travel lane will be maintained at all times with police directing traffic as needed.

Raised manhole covers within the roadway may pose obstacles for vehicles and bicyclists. Please exercise caution traveling through Atlantic Avenue and seek alternate routes when possible. The construction may cause noise disruption during the work hours of 7:00 AM to 3:30 PM.
